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The NSRA reserves the right to amend the programme due to extenuating circumstances.

MEETING ORGANISATION

Control

The Meeting is controlled by the Rifle Committee. All shooting will be under the control of the Chief Range Officer and the Assistant Range Officers.

The Meeting Referees adjudicate on all matters pertaining to Rules and Conditions of entry. The Range Committee will be responsible for all other matters.

The names of the Meeting Referees and the Range Committee will be displayed on the official Notice Board for the duration of the Meeting. Decisions taken by either body will be final and binding for the period of the Meeting.

Conditions of Entry

Entry to all the competitions in this programme is conditional upon the competitor being a Life, Annual or Associate Member of the NSRA or paying the Meeting Membership fee.

Entry Fees

Entry fees must be paid in full prior to shooting. Late entries to **unsquadded** competitions taking place on Century range may be accepted from competitors who have already entered the meeting, subject to range space.

In the event of a competitor being unable to attend the meeting, a refund of entry fees (excluding registration) will be given if a medical certificate, or other relevant paperwork, is produced.

Team Registration

Team Registrations are to be notified on the Entry Form or, if made at the Meeting on the form provided, by the time stated in the programme.

Discipline

Any order exhibited on the Notice Board by the authority of the Range Committee and/or the Meeting Referees shall have the same force and effect as the NSRA Regulations. Any printed rule which conflicts with the conditions determined by these notes is automatically suspended for the duration of the Meeting.

A competitor on whom any penalty is imposed may appeal only against that part of the penalty which extends beyond the period of the Meeting and such appeals must be lodged within one month of the close of the Meeting.

Competitors shall have the right, if they desire, to state their own case at some period during the proceedings before a decision is made. Every endeavour will be made to notify competitors when matters concerning them are to be discussed but in the event of the competitors having left the Meeting they shall automatically forfeit that right.

Competitor's Number Badge

You will have been given your competitor's number badge when registering at the Administration Marquee (open from 15.00 to 18.00 Friday and one hour before shooting commences each day). This current badge **AND NO OTHER** must be worn at all times when shooting and pinned where it can be read easily by a Range Officer.

CONDUCT OF SHOOTING

Classification

There will be five classes of shooters, namely X, A, B, C and D for all prone competitions, except Any Sights competitions where there will be four classes namely X, A, B and C. The three positions competitions will be in four classes namely A, B, C and D. Competitors will retain their current Classification subject to the following.

Competitors may elect to shoot in a class higher than their National Classification (but not X) and will thereafter be deemed to hold that higher classification. If seeking to enter prone Class A, a current average of not less than 98.0 (short range) or 580 (50m) must be declared.

The onus for entering the correct class rests upon the competitor. The NSRA reserves the right to re-classify any competitor at any time.

Unclassified Competitors

An unclassified competitor is one who did not enter or entered but did not fire in an Aggregate at an NSRA Rifle Meeting in the two preceding years.

Unclassified competitors must substantiate their class by submitting the average of the best 10 of their last 12 scores on British NSRA (BM/89 Series) short range targets or an average ex 600 on 50 metre international/50 yard proportional NSRA targets fired up to the time of entry.

The average will determine classification as under:

The averages must be certified correct by the Secretary or Captain of the Club. The penalty for submitting an untrue average will be disqualification of the competitor for the remainder of the calendar year from all small-bore shooting events and such other penalties as may be determined against the competitor and other signatory by the NSRA.

Promotions & Demotions

Promotions and demotions will be based on performance in:

- (a) The Championship Aggregate; or
- (b) The Weekend Aggregate (if the Championship Aggregate is not entered).

All competitors in Classes A, B, C and D who finish in the top 10% will be promoted to a higher class, the particular class to be at the discretion of the Shooting Manager. All competitors who finish in the bottom 10% will be demoted one class.

Competitors who do not complete the aggregate, without good reason, will have their recorded scores averaged and the resultant final total will be taken into consideration when classifications are decided.

Timing of Promotion/Demotion

Competitors who earn promotion or demotion from the Scottish Meeting will be reclassified for this Meeting.

Firing Point

The firing point positions will be numbered to correspond with the target numbers and competitors will fire from within their allotted space (Rule 6.9.5).

The firing point on Century Range is tarmac covered by tarpaulins on scaffolding framework but personal ground covering should be provided. Come prepared for wet weather and uneven ground.

Rule 8.10 On Century Range no firing point coverings (on the surface of the firing point) are provided by the NSRA. Therefore Rule 8.10 is interpreted as referring to the mat or mats provided by competitors (i.e. elbow mats of mean uniform thickness not exceeding 50mm (2") uncompressed may be used).

Any doubts over whether any equipment may infringe a Rule should be submitted to the Meeting Referees before starting to shoot. Do not chance it, we want all competitors to have an enjoyable and carefree Meeting.

Spectators and competitors who are not shooting are not permitted within the roped off area immediately behind the firing point when a detail is in progress.

Wind Indicators

Only the official wind indicators which are provided are to be used. They must not be moved or removed without a Range Officer's permission.

There will be two lines of flags. The first will be at 10m from the firing point, situated every other lane and the second row will be at 40m, placed every 4th lane.

Target Control

The Target Control system will be employed for UNSQUADED shooting only. Target Control for booking and collection of targets and backers will be located in the Admin Marquee.

Competitors may reserve available firing points for themselves for up to three details. Competitors are entitled to three consecutive details only, but they may continue on the same firing point provided that it has not been reserved for another competitor.

Targets

1989 50 metre and 100 yard 3 card system targets will be used. Targets and backers are to be collected daily from Target Control. Do not take more than your immediate requirements. Only targets issued on the day of shooting will be scored. **No targets may be removed from the Range Area.**

Any unshot targets found in tents at the close of the Meeting will be invoiced to the tent occupier.

Any competitor found in possession of targets outside the range area may be liable for disqualification from the Meeting.

Target Fixing on Century Range

Competitors must provide their own bulldog clips. It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure that the target is fixed securely in the correct position on the hardboard frame. In windy weather 16 clips are recommended to hold both target and backer. Bulldog clips will be on sale at the Meeting.

Targets must be fixed to the frames with the sighting diagram(s) at the top.

Stickers

One sticker will be issued for each 20 shots to be fired in a competition and scores will be shown as points scored.

Before placing targets and backers on the butts, competitors must place the appropriate sticker(s) in the space provided at the top of the target and write their Firing Point Number and Detail Number in both the upper and lower boxes on the target and once on the backer. Where a sticker for an Unsquadded competition is placed on the wrong target, the score will not be recorded.

Replacement stickers may be purchased from Stats at £2.00 each.

Concurrent Shooting

If two or more stickers are placed on the same card the score will count for the appropriate competitions. Each sticker in an Aggregate must be fired separately. All other competitions may be fired concurrently and there is no restriction upon the number of stickers to be placed on one card.

No individual competition, except the Queen Alexandra Cup Individual Competition, may be shot concurrently with any competition in which coaching is allowed.

Time Allowance

Twenty minutes will be allowed for firing each 20-shot course, including unlimited sighting shots, with 15 minutes target changing time between details. Competitors should be ready to fix their target at the butts **FIFTEEN MINUTES** before starting time for the detail. This timing will **NOT** apply to competitions fired on the Malcolm Cooper Range (Three Positions and the Double English Match) where ISSF timings apply.

Squadded Events

Squadded competitions will be fired at the times stated in the programme and according to your personal Squadding Notice or the squadding lists exhibited in the Marquee.

No change in squadding is permitted. No one may shoot in a squadded event other than in accordance with the squadding notice.

So far as possible all competitors in a particular Class will fire in the same squad. This may not be possible if entries exceed range space.

Unsquadded Events

At certain times the range will be free for unsquadded shooting by arrangement (see Target Control, page 5).

Telescope Sights

Any competitor using telescope sights must advise the Range Officer of their intention to do so, prior to the start of the detail.

Shooting Position

See NSRA Rule 8.12.

Cross Shooting

We take pride in the rapid recording of scores and believe that competitors appreciate the prompt service. Cross-shooting delays scoring and consequently the posting of results. If you do unfortunately cross shoot please write full particulars on your card.

After Shooting

On completing a detail competitors must remove their target and backer from the butts immediately and return them either to the collecting tables behind the firing point, or as instructed by the Chief Range Officer (CRO), whether or not completed. Practice cards must be handed in.

If not continuing on the next detail competitors must remove their equipment to the rear of the firing point once instructed to do so by the CRO. This enables the next competitors to place their equipment on the firing point before going forward.

Scoring and Tie Breaking

In accordance with NSRA Rules 5.1, 5.3 & 5.5 except that in the event of an unbreakable tie for final placings where there is a trophy, after the application of the standard tie break rules, the number of inner cartons, initially at the longer distance, shall be taken into account. In the Aggregates (comps. 7 and 11) ties will be broken by working back through the constituent competitions in competition number order.

Challenges

Challenges and missing recorded scores for Single Entry Competitions must be submitted on the day of shooting, where the card is shot prior to 13.00, or by noon on the day after shooting where the card is shot after 13.00. No challenges may be made after 18.00 on Friday 19th August.

Competitors should check that all their scores are posted before they leave the Meeting. Missing scores cannot be claimed after 12.00 noon on Saturday. Unshot stickers should be handed to the Shooting Manager as soon as it is known that they will not be used to help staff when trying to locate missing scores. Errors in scoring or recording of scores are subject to correction by the Shooting Manager at any time.

Challenge fee is £2.00 per card, refundable if the challenge is upheld

Completion of Competitions

All single entry unsquadded team and individual competitions must be fired by 10.15 Friday.

Security

Competitors are reminded that it is their responsibility to safeguard their rifles and ammunition at all times in accordance with current legislation. The Meeting is adequately covered for normal risks but the NSRA does not accept responsibility for articles which are lost or stolen from the range or its surroundings.

RANGE SAFETY

General Safety

NSRA Rule 1.9.1 states that:

"The safety of shooters, range officers, spectators and the general public is of paramount importance and requires continued and careful attention to handling of rifles, pistols and crossbows, and caution in moving about in the range. Self-discipline is necessary on the part of all. Where such self-discipline is lacking, it is the duty of range officers to enforce discipline and the duty of shooters and officials to cooperate and assist in such enforcement."

Dangerous or Unsafe Conduct

NSRA Rule 6.1.8 states that:

"A shooter may be suspended from shooting and ordered from the firing point by a Range Officer for dangerous conduct or for contravening any order, rule or condition of the competitions, and the matter shall be reported by the Range Officer and dealt with by the Meeting Referees."

Safety of Firearms

Rifles may only be loaded at the firing point and only after the signal to commence fire has been given. No loaded rifle may be taken from the firing point or fired in any direction except at the targets. A rifle shall be deemed to be loaded when a live round is in the breech whether or not the rifle is cocked.

Breeches must not be closed on live rounds unless the rifle is in the shoulder. At all other times when a rifle is uncased the breech must remain fully opened with a breech flag in the breech or the bolt or action removed.

If a competitor leaves the firing point before the end of a detail they must ensure that their rifle is left in a safe condition.

All competitors are encouraged wherever practicable, on the grounds of both safety and security of rifles, to remove bolts/actions as soon as possible after shooting and to replace them on the firing point when next shooting, and to store bolts/actions and barrels in separate secure locations in the intervening periods.

Live rounds

It is the responsibility of every competitor to ensure that no live rounds are left on the firing point.

Entry to the Firing Point

No one may enter the firing point without permission from a Range Officer (RO).

Range Commands and Signals

A. "NO MORE TARGETS, NO MORE TARGETS"

Fifteen minutes will be allowed for target changing. Five minutes prior to the commencement of each detail the Chief Range Officer (CRO) will announce '**No more targets, No more targets**' when no competitor may go forward of the firing point unless instructed verbally to do so by an RO.

B. "COMMENCE FIRE"

This will be preceded by '**settle down**' followed by a '**stand-by**' warning announcement by the CRO after which rifles may not be touched until the hooter sounds.

C. "CEASEFIRE"

A tone will sound continuously for the last five seconds of the detail. Shots may be fired during the tone but not after it has stopped.

After the tone has ceased, the CRO will say 'unload', 'make your rifle safe with the bolt or action removed or breech plug inserted'.

D "Competitors please stand at the back of the firing point"

This command is issued by the CRO so that all rifles can be checked by the RO's to ensure that they are safe.

E. EMERGENCY SIGNAL

The sounding of the starting tone during a detail will indicate an emergency stop when all shooting must cease immediately.

Shots fired before the commence fire signal or after the cease fire signal may result in disqualification of the card and the competitor will be reported to the Meeting Referees for dangerous conduct and for possible further action.

Smoking

Smoking is prohibited on the firing point, in the Lord Roberts Centre and in tents.

ABUSE OF DRUGS

Definition

Drug abuse is the use by or distribution to a competitor of substances defined as being in contravention of existing rules. The identification of a forbidden substance and/ or one of its metabolites, or the presence of specified amounts of endogenous substances subject to quantitative analysis, in a body fluid will constitute an offence and the offender may be penalised.

Any person assisting or inciting others in the contravention of these regulations shall be considered as having committed an offence against these rules and may be subject to disciplinary action.

Drug Testing

Any competitor must, if requested by an official designated by the NSRA for the purpose of drug control, submit to a drug control test. Failure to do so will be taken as if a positive result had been obtained and dealt with accordingly.

Exceptions

Except where other Federation or Union rules disallow it, competitors and shooters who have valid medical reasons for taking drugs which are proscribed will, subject to certain provisions being met, be permitted to enter for or be eligible for selection for individual and team competitions respectively at National and International level. No inhibition will be placed upon their ability to win a prize. Competitors falling within this category must provide to the NSRA, prior to an event in which drug testing takes place, a certificate to that effect signed by their doctor.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the NSRA will reserve the right, with the competitor's permission, to request its Medical Adviser to verify the details of the case with the doctor.

WARNING: It could be highly dangerous for a competitor to give up or reduce a drug regularly taken. No competitor should take such a course without medical advice.

Competitors taking any prescribed drugs MUST declare them before shooting.

ADMINISTRATION

Car Parking

Only cars with NSRA official passes are permitted within the NSRA ranges or tentage area.

ATTENTION IS DIRECTED TO THE SPEED LIMIT OF 15 MPH IN BISLEY CAMP.

Catering

The usual snack and cafeteria services will be available over the duration of the meeting.

Litter

Receptacles will be provided for litter. Your cooperation in keeping the range and its surrounding area free of litter will be appreciated. Plastic bags will also be provided in every tent.

The success of our Meetings depends always, of course, on the full co-operation of the competitors and in this respect we ask you kindly to help us keep down the costs and, therefore, the cost to yourselves by reducing to a minimum the expenses of range clearance. Please always pick up your empty cartridge cases at the completion of your detail and, if you occupy an Association or Club Tent, ensure that it is completely clear with all rubbish deposited in the dustbins on vacating.

Photography

No photographs may be taken without permission. Flash photography is forbidden in the vicinity of the firing point when shooting is in progress. Any contravention of this Regulation may result in disciplinary action being taken against the offender in accordance with the provisions of Rules 1.7 and 6.1.8.

Dogs

On Century Range dogs must be kept under control at all times whilst shooting is in progress and are not allowed forward of the firing point. Dogs are not permitted in Lord Roberts Centre, except for guide dogs.

Mobile Telephones

The use of mobile telephones forward of the safety barrier behind the firing point and on the Malcolm Cooper Range is not allowed and in these areas they must be switched off.

Trading

The NSRA reserves control of the sole rights for the sale of equipment, ammunition, and all other shooting requirements within the NSRA ranges or tentage area bounded by the NRA 300 yards firing points and the NSRA firing points.

Trade tents and stands can be supplied or permitted to Manufacturers' Accredited Agents. Traders will be liable for a trading licence fee payable to the NSRA.

A supply service for all .22 equipment and ammunition will be provided from NSRA Headquarters.

<p>Open to teams representing England, Scotland, Northern Ireland, Wales, Jersey, Guernsey and Isle of Man. Teams representing overseas countries may take part for honours only, range space permitting.</p> <p>Conditions: Prone Matches: 20 shots at 50 m and 20 shots at 100 yds per team member.</p> <p>Intent of entry by the Small-bore Shooting Union or equivalent organisation must be made in writing to the NSRA not later than 10 days before the meeting commences. Team selection and method of selection is the responsibility of each Small-bore Shooting Union, or equivalent. A captain and secretary, either or both of whom may shoot, may be appointed in addition.</p> <p>Home countries selectors may include in their team shooters who have not entered the meeting, on prepayment of a registration fee of £6.50 per shooter. Members of the team and team officials must be Life, Annual or Associate Members of the NSRA and must also be qualified in accordance with NSRA Rule 3.2.</p> <p>The names of the team and reserves for the 3 positions match must be notified to the Chief Statistical Officer by 08.00 on Saturday before shooting commences.</p> <p>The names of the team and reserves for the prone matches must be notified to the Chief Statistical Officer by 11.00 on Friday, when the draw for positions will be made. The prone matches will take place on Friday at 16.05.</p> <p>Members of winning teams will receive an NSRA Gold Medal. Embroidered emblematic blazer badges may be purchased from Headquarters. Team members and officials should assemble for assemble for photographs after the conclusion of the matches.</p> <p>The CAT HARTOP CUP will be awarded to the highest-scoring competitor in any of the Home Countries International Prone Matches.</p>
